Holy Trinity Episcopal School of Greater Houston, Inc. (HTES) is currently seeking a Head of School to begin leadership in the 2018-19 school year (beginning July 1, 2018). Our Head of School should have experience in education at all levels. Our Head of School will be the spiritual and developmental leader for the staff and students. The successful candidate will champion our school's unique history and traditions.

History

In early 1994, a group of parents and interested parties in the Atascocita-Kingwood area met to formulate plans for a superior quality private school for northeast Harris County within the discipline and care of the Episcopalian Church. Contact was made with two local churches, Christ the King Episcopal Church of Atascocita and Good Shepherd Episcopal Church of Kingwood. The committee incorporated the school that year.

The school opened in 1999 on a temporary campus owned by, and adjacent to, Christ the King Episcopal Church, serving 13 students in Kindergarten through fourth grade. In February 2004, the school moved to its current 79 acre location on Lockwood Road, and began serving students in Pre-k to 8th grade. Upper school classes began in 2009 and the first graduate received a diploma in 2012. In 2011, HTES piloted a program with Including Kids, a school for students with autism and other related delays. Including Kids has its own building on our campus and is considered a school within a school.

HTES currently has 115 students, pre-kindergarten through high school, 18 faculty/staff, and is accredited through Southwestern Association of Episcopal Schools (SAES).

The school also must increase enrollment over the immediate five-year period.

Our new Head of School will take ownership over an incredibly enriched learning environment. A focus on enhancing the curriculum and supporting curriculum development is expected. We also seek a Head of School to continue to strengthen our relationship with the Episcopal Diocese of Texas and who is ready to become a fully engaged part of our community.









Candidate Qualifications

The Board of Directors is interested in candidates who are educational visionaries, who will honor our unique talents and history and embrace our unique partnership with Including Kids. The school is seeking candidates with the following skills and experience:
