Plan, develop and implement all aspects of a weekly youth group gathering (The EDGE = $6^{th} - 12^{th}$ graders) + a biweekly gathering of older elementary age (LEDGES = $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ graders)

Coordinate and oversee the Acolyte Program

Be aware of resources for developing the youth ministry programming and participate in continuing education events and training opportunities in the Diocese of Texas

Meet with the rector on a weekly basis

Attend weekly Staff Meetings

Mentor youth in developing their leadership skills

Recruit and train volunteers who work with youth in all aspects of youth ministry and ensure adequate volunteer support and adult to youth ratios are followed.

Be a liaison between the church and other community organizations, people and resources that relate to youth and youth ministries Coordinate Sunday School curriculum for youth (grades 6-12) and recruit teachers in partnership with the Children's Education Minister

Coordinate and teach the Youth Confirmation classes in partnership with the clergy and provide leadership for confirmands and parents beyond the classroom.

Develop Youth Outreach Programs and an annual Mission Trip Keep records of youth participation and mange the youth ministry budget

Communicate in a timely manner and as effectively as possible using all available resources (email, website, e-newletter, bulletin boards, phone calls, social media, etc.) with church staff and leadership, youth and their parents plus the congregation Make yourself available to youth in a variety of ways (i.e. meeting for lunch or coffee, attendance at extracurricular activities, support during times of crisis, etc.)

Work in concert with the gifts and talents of other staff members and maintain a teamwork mentality

Ensure that the Safeguarding God's Children policies are observed in all youth ministry settings

Qualifications:

Well-grounded and robust Christian faith, with the ability to articulate it to young people

A demonstrated commitment to working with children, youth and parents

Outstanding leadership and relationship skills for educating, inspiring and empowering young people, teachers, volunteers, parents and reaching out to newcomers

Bachelor's degree; a degree in Youth Ministry, Christian Education or Certificate of Youth Ministry is especially welcomed

At least 2 years' work experience in youth ministry, children's and family ministry and/or Christian Education and Formation High integrity, sound judgment in challenging situations, ability to make quick decisions, grace under pressure and a good sense of humor

Employment is contingent on successful completion of background check
